

Making a good online password is one of the most important steps for you to take to protect your online accounts. This is not easy...it can be a pain to determine what password you should create and worst of all, having to remember passwords for every service you are using online. Here are a few ideas to help you create a unique password you can remember.

Instead of thinking of a word for your password, remember a phrase. For example: "Where Is Community Circle Going Next?" Then take the first letter of each word, which in this case will be "WICCGN?". Leaving the question mark at the end helps make it a stronger password.

The next step is to add numbers to the password. I will use "55" because 55 is the magic number to join Community Circle. The new phrased password will look like this "WICCGN?55." This will be the master phrase password.

Now to use it for different services you can use the company name. In this case I will use Community National Bank. My new password will look like this CNBWICCGN?55. If you were going to use your master phrase password for your FaceBook account it would look like this. FBWICCGN?55. I think you get the idea.
